Gov. Corbett Launches Tourism and Heritage Exploration on Susquehanna in the Endless Mountains

Pennsylvania Governor Tom Corbett visited the Endless Mountains to begin his tour of Pennsylvania's treasured

outdoors on Wednesday, August 10th. With Endless Mountains Visitors Bureau (EMVB) serving as a host for the visit, Governor Corbett paddled the North Branch from Mehoopany to Tunkhannock in Wyoming County. Having lunch with regional leaders in heritage and tourism, the Governor remarked that the North Branch offered some of the most beautiful vistas and opportunities to view wildlife in the state and the nation. He was especially impressed with the Vosburg Neck area and the Howland Preserve, with historical and natural attributes including canal features which remain intact today because of the 1886-construction of the Vosburg Tunnel.

"We were able to talk with the Governor about the opportunities, challenges and impacts associated with the Marcellus Shale natural gas exploration, collection and transmission," said Swank, "while exploring ways the private and public sectors can work collaboratively to preserve, enhance and promote our region's natural and man-made assets." New Park Along the Greenway is Dedicated Streater Park, Bloomsburg

Just over 14 months ago, the SEDA-COG Community Resource Center (CRC) completed a master site plan for a new park in the Columbia County town of Bloomsburg. That plan has now begun to take shape with the dedication of Streater Park, a 55-acre site at the confluence of Fishing Creek and the Susquehanna River.



For now Streater Park includes two soccer fields. However the plan includes football and softball fields, picnic

pavilions and trails that would connect it with Bloomsburg Town Park and the Rupert Covered Bridge. More athletic fields will be built after completion of an engineering study. Brian Keeler has focused on the Susquehanna River as one of his main sources of interest for many years. He derives the primary source of inspiration for his river images from the beautiful

stretch of river in Bradford County, but he has also depicted the river shores in the Wyoming Valley near Wilkes-Barre and throughout the river's course. He values the time on the river as an important part of the picture-making process. Sometimes stopping to paint while driving past a favorite location or in a kayak when he paddles out to paint these studies from direct observation, they all have their own way of contributing to studio paintings.

River Access Improvements on the North Branch

Progress is taking place in the implementation of the Susquehanna River North Branch Water Trail Project—Phase II. Water Trail Coordinator David Buck worked with the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) and the PA Fish & Boat



Commission on the design of wayfinding signage (depicted in photo) for installation at public access points on the river. Paddlers will readily identify access points as well as picnic and camping areas.

The staff and volunteers of North Branch Land Trust (NBLT) have completed the river access area restoration at the historic Howland Preserve and the design and fabrication of site signage. NBLT is incorporating the river access with riparian buffer improvements, walking trails, and parking area development with the overall management plan associated with this magnificent site on the oxbow at Vosburg Neck in Wyoming County. Endless Mountains Heritage Region partnered with PA Game Commission on restoration of a river access and site

enhancements at the State Game Lands 237 in Terry Township in Bradford County. Volunteer Gary Stevens (retired game officer) supervised students of Wyalusing Valley High School in re-establishing the river access area on the state game lands, as well as removing invasive plants, constructing benches, and designing and developing a parking area at the Game Lands site as well as a new river access in the Borough of Laceyville.

Development of Seneca Trail Underway

An historic iron truss bridge is being restored and made the anchor facility on a bicycle/pedestrian trail in Wyoming County thanks to fundraising by local groups and major gifts provided by Proctor & Gamble Corporation and Chesapeake Energy. With grantwriting and fund management provided by Endless Mountain Heritage Region (EMHR), Eaton Township Supervisors are well on their way to bridge restoration and trail development. Funding from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) and PennDOT is in place to fund the engineering studies and bridge reconstruction leading up to trail development and marketing.

The planned six-mile trail will re-connect residents in the Village of Eatonville and incorporate magnificent rural scenery along Bowman's Creek and Miller Mountain near Tunkhannock and the Susquehanna River North Branch. EMHR plans to administer all donations and grant funds and pursue additional resources through the Pennsylvania Heritage Areas Program to develop trail signage, mapping and marketing products.

New Trail Section Created



The Friends of Milton State Park, in partnership with PA DCNR, are continuing their efforts to construct and maintain a network of trails at Milton State Park. In July, a new connector trail was constructed linking the South Trail and the Mid-Trail. The state park is an 82-acre island

on the West Branch Susquehanna River within the Susquehanna Greenway. "The island is a green refuge for those seeking shade, a place to walk and easy access to the river," said Tom Dean, President of the Friends of Milton State Park. Until recently the entire island, outside of the soccer fields and river access, was overrun with Japanese knotweed, an invasive plant that made walking the island impossible. Gradually the 'Friends' have created several miles of trail.

"When most people think of Milton State Park - they immediately think of AYSO Soccer. The Friends, through the development of the new playground and trails are creating reasons for others to visit the park," said Friends volunteer Paul Yost.

"The view from the southern end of the island - is one of my favorite spots on the River," said Brian Auman, a regional coordinator for the Susquehanna Greenway and volunteer with the Friends. "If you haven't hiked the trails - you should come out. The South Trail is especially shady and green - a beautiful walk on even the hottest summer days," said Auman.

Environmental Education Grant Opportunity Bradford County

The Bradford County Commissioners have created a new and innovative Environmental Education Grant Program and asked Phil Swank, Endless Mountain Heritage Region, Executive Director, to provide leadership in this initiative administered by the Bradford County Conservation District. Professionals representing state parks, rural electrification, cooperative extension, forest landowners associations, rural development agencies and private industry advise on program management and allocation of funds.

The Bradford County Commissioners spearheaded the education fund in 2010 using revenues derived from landfill tipping fees levied on Marcellus Shale natural gas drilling operations "drill cuttings" that are disposed of at the Northern Tier Solid Waste Authority. The program supports local environmental education and stewardship efforts which incorporate strong partnerships, significant numbers of people served, innovation, history of success and sustainability. Investing in Our River Towns

The Turkey Hill Experience

This article is the first in a series designed to illustrate examples of private individual and business investments in post-industrial river towns that foster more sustainable economic development through green building design, reuse/rehabilitation, or a focus on heritage- or eco-tourism within the Susquehanna Greenway.



When Turkey Hill Dairy began the search for a suitable location for company exhibit, dining, and retail space twenty years ago, they knew that Lancaster County's undeveloped farmland was out of the question. Citing a strong commitment to both farmland preservation and the desire to see redevelopment in existing urban areas, the company eventually located the exhibit and store in the historic Ashley & Bailey Silk Mill in Columbia, PA. The three-story red brick building was built in 1899 to process imported raw silk, and later housed the Tidy Products sewing company until it closed in the 1970s. While decades of vacancy had left it windowless, blanketed in vines, and sprouting trees from the top floor, developers salvaged much of the original facade. The Experience opened in June and the company estimates over 200,000 visitors this year. While most of the exhibits require admission, there is a public lobby where visitors learn about the history of the Turkey Hill Dairy, Lancaster County agriculture, and the local river towns of Columbia, Marietta, and Wrightsville. Researcher's on the River

Cynthia Venn & Christopher Hallen



Bloomsburg University Professors Cynthia Venn and Christopher Hallen are teaming up to engage students in river research projects. Venn, an oceanographer/marine chemist, is an Associate Professor of Geography and Geosciences. Hallen is an analytical chemist and Professor of Chemistry

and Biochemistry. Their research team had its beginning when they started team teaching a class in Aqueous Geochemistry almost 12 years ago. The course features field studies including an independent research project for each student or team of students that are then presented at regional Geological Society of America meetings. From these projects has grown an ongoing research partnership that includes abandoned mine drainage studies, studies of water quality at sites that may be impacted by external sources such as Marcellus drilling, and work with the Susquehanna River Heartland Coalition for Environmental Studies yielding chemical data to support several of the organizations geologist and biologists.
