On January 16, 2015, Renovo residents and others from Western Clinton County attended a public meeting to discuss ideas and projects to make the community more connected to the Susquehanna River.

The meeting was organized by Preserve, Renew and Revitalize (PRR), a new non-profit organization in the Greater Renovo Area and the Susquehanna Greenway Partnership.

Over 100 people attended and discussed the natural environment, built environment, community life, and the downtown environment. "The River Towns Program will be a testing ground to prove to others that Western Clinton County can work together and that we can take on larger regional projects." said Alice Tarr, a representative from Chapman Township.

The meeting included highlights from the SEDA-COG Community Development Program that is helping the area move forward by providing assistance with infrastructure and grant opportunities. With the support of the Clinton County Commissioners, SEDA-COG is developing a \$750,000 grant application for improvements in the Ontario Street area, which include street and pedestrian facility improvements, infrastructure upgrades, and removal of blighted structures.

Moving forward, all five municipalities are working to complete River Town Program applications. The feedback from the public meeting will be used to prioritize community based projects and to identify potential funding sources to implement these projects.

New Recreation Site Planned in Luzerne County



There is something to be said for working with, and not against the unrelenting forces of nature. Jenkins Township residents and supervisors in Luzerne County should be commended for their recent decision to convert a portion of the township floodplain into a large community recreation site with natural conserved areas.

In 2011 flood waters inundated homes near the river and many owners accepted federal buyouts of their floodplain properties. Altogether, almost 20 acres of property was transferred to the township. Seeing opportunity in this new situation, the township has decided to apply for state funding to transform the empty lots into conserved, natural areas with trees and vegetation, as well as recreation fields, parking, and an area for seasonal uses like a farmer's market. News from the West: Rain Gardens & Plantings Coming to Jersey Shore

New partnerships and exciting projects are sprouting along the West Branch in Jersey Shore, PA.



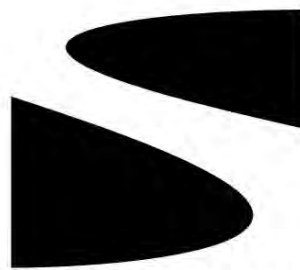
As part of the Susquehanna Greenway River Towns program, the community is improving its connection to the River with a new public river access. Looking to "green" its future, the local River Town Team and Jersey Shore Borough have partnered with Penn State University Master Gardeners - Lycoming County to design and help plant two large rain gardens and a vegetated area, or "buffer strip" beside the river access area.

These natural areas will capture rainwater, sediment and play a role in keeping the West Branch clean by slowing erosion and lessening flooding. [Read more and see photos here.](#)

The arts have a new home along the river, as the Susquehanna Art Museum officially opened to the public on January 16, 2015 in midtown Harrisburg.

With a nod to recycling and reusing, the building is a mixture of old and new. The 20,000 square foot space includes the former Keystone Bank

Resources for River Towns:

Parks and Trails Toolkit

Kids need 60 minutes of daily physical activity to maintain good health. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, less than 30% of youth achieve this goal. Additionally, more than 25% of adults report no leisure-time physical activity. Being physically active is one of the most important steps we can all take to improve our health!



To encourage outdoor activity today, the CDC developed a parks and trails toolkit that will help communities create parks with expanded health benefits. Parks and trails along the Susquehanna Greenway can improve health in several ways including:

- Increased physical activity- walkable access to appropriate sites motivates people to participate in physical activity and to do so more frequently;
- Improved mental health- parks can serve as a venue for stress reduction;
- Environmental benefits- parks can reduce air and water pollution, protect hazard areas (e.g., flood plains, unstable slopes) from inappropriate development, and mitigate urban heat islands;
- Community interaction- parks can provide meeting places for neighbors;
- Reduce injury- parks and trails can provide safe spaces for people to play and exercise, away from busy streets and commercial zones.

Chesapeake is accepting project proposals from partners for financial assistance awards. Awards range from \$10,000 to \$125,000, or potentially higher. The requested funds must be matched by an equal (1:1) or greater amount of non-Federal support dedicated to the project.

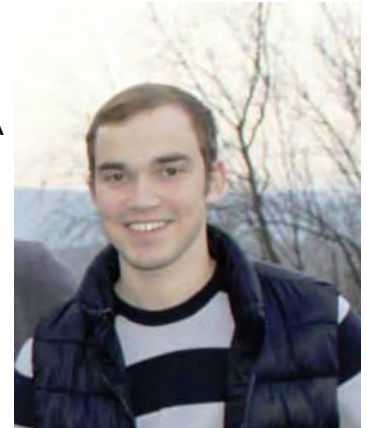
Applications must be submitted by Friday, April 10, 2015. Potential project applicants must carefully review the Program Guidelines & Application Instructions. [Read more here.](#)
