Third Workshop on River Towns is Planned

A public forum on Pennsylvania's Statewide Historic Preservation Plan will be held at a workshop on river towns, Tuesday, June 28 in the Education Auditorium at the PPL Montour Preserve near Washingtonville. *Community Building for River Towns* is the third in a series of workshops offered through the SEDA-COG Community Resource Center (CRC) and Susquehanna Greenway Partnership (SGP).

The registration fee is \$15, which includes lunch. The registration form can be found at www.susquehannagreenway.org.

The public forum will be moderated by Bryan Van Sweden and Andrea MacDonald of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission (PHMC). As part of the process to update the Historic Preservation Plan, over 2,200 individuals completed a survey last summer, identifying the places, landscapes, and characteristics they value in their communities. The results of that survey will be presented, and the workshop's participants will discuss how to best maintain community assets through the Commonwealth's preservation, conservation, and revitalization programs.
