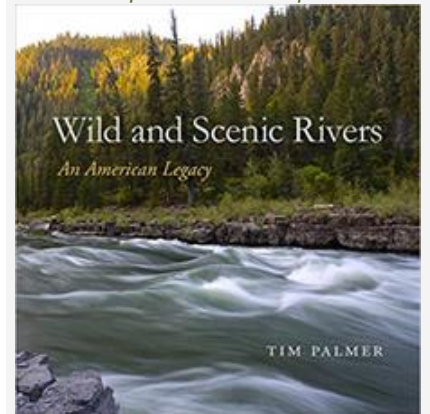

Shikellamy State Park is located at the confluence (meeting point) of the West Branch and North Branch of the Susquehanna River. The Park is divided into two main sections: 1) the Overlook on the western shore of the West Branch, and 2) a Marina on the southern portion of Packer's Island along the North Branch. The Overlook offers amazing views of the confluence and West Branch from 360 feet above the water, as well as a hiking trail and picnic pavilion. On Packer's Island, the Marina offers walking and biking trails, and a scenic view of Lake Augusta and the Susquehanna River. Keep an eye out in the early morning and afternoon for the rowers, who utilize the calm waters of Lake Augusta for practice...

City Island Park is located in the middle of the Susquehanna River, just opposite the city of Harrisburg. Those looking for a more scenic, peaceful day on the island should explore the nature walk along several island trails. This 224 acre park in Lancaster County offers an amazing view of the Lower Susquehanna River. Located on a wooded plateau, visitors often come to Susquehannock State Park to visit one of the three overlooks above the river, which feature observation decks. From 380 feet, you can see a panoramic view of the Susquehanna River, as well as the Conowingo Reservoir, Mount Johnson Island, and a variety of wildlife across the landscape. Other recreational opportunities available within the park include 80 picnic tables and 20 grills, a playground, the state record beech tree, volleyball court, two softball fields, and 5 miles of hiking trails...
