

BikeShare Regulations

1. Cyclists must be 18 years old. Ages 16-17 permitted with parent or guardian.
2. A current, valid driver's license and credit card must be left with attendant while bike is in use.
3. Wilkes-Barre BikeShare liability waiver must be completed.
4. BikeShare operates from dawn 'til dusk. Program will not run in inclement weather.
5. Borrower is responsible to return bike on time to avoid being reported to Wilkes-Barre Police Department and charges placed on the credit card. Borrower is responsible for all damages including but not limited to:
 - Stolen bike or parts
 - Flat tire or bent rim
 - Any other damage that make bike inoperable

Bicycle Safety

1. Obey traffic signs and signals and ride with traffic, about a car door length from parked cars. Use streets to ride downtown. According to the PA Vehicle code, it's illegal to ride on sidewalks downtown.
2. Be predictable to cars. Use hand signals to indicate turning direction. Point right when turning right, point left when turning left.
3. Although helmets are not required, we suggest you wear a helmet. Helmets have been proven to reduce the risk of head injuries. Helmets are available for purchase at local bicycle stores and big box retailers.

FAQ and BikeShare Info

Wilkes-Barre BikeShare is a community based bike share program. Bikes are loaned out, free of charge!

What do I need?

You must be 18 years old and have a current, valid driver's license or state issued photo ID. License must be left with attendant. Age 16-17 with a parent or guardian.

Where do I borrow the bike?

Just visit the front desk at Best Western Genetti Hotel & Conference Center, 77 East Market Street in Downtown Wilkes-Barre

Where can I ride the bike?

Wherever you chose, as long as you are not trespassing.

How long can I use the bike?

Bike must be returned on the same day as being borrowed.

Can I reserve a bike to use?

You may call 1 hour in advance and a bike will be held. At times bikes may be unavailable due to community events.

Can I keep the bike?

No. The bicycles are for everyone in the community to enjoy. Bike must be returned on the same day as being borrowed.

Suggested Bike Excursions *See numbers on map*

Wilkes-Barre and the Wyoming Valley are protected from the Susquehanna River by an extensive levee system. The Susquehanna River Levee Trail is a 12 mile eight foot wide paved asphalt trail on top of the levee on both the east and west sides of the river. The trail system boasts informational kiosks that explain the area's rich industrial and social history.

1 Diamond City Discovery:

Explore Wilkes-Barre's beautiful downtown and where in any direction you will find restaurants, shopping, movies, historic buildings, mansions, churches and synagogues, cultural events, the Osterhout Library, Wilkes University, Kings College, YMCA, Luzerne County Historical Society Museum, F.M. Kirby Center, River Common Park and more. Use the Walk Wilkes-Barre Historical Society brochure to create your own downtown adventure.

2 Riverside Ramble:

A 4 mile trail on the east side of the Susquehanna through Wilkes-Barre and Hanover Township. At the Market Street Bridge, take the trail south through the River Common; the river is on your right. At West River Street follow the on-street markings to connect with the east side Levee Trail system in south Wilkes-Barre. You will see Wilkes University, the historic district mansions, parks, natural areas and river scenery. At the Carey Street Bridge, an on-street connection accesses the trail to the Plymouth Reach Levee Trail system on the west side of the river for shopping and refreshment.

3 Anthracite Heritage Trail:

A 3.5 mile trail on the west side of the Susquehanna, going south through the towns of Kingston and Edwardsville. Cross the Market Street Bridge and access the trail in Kirby Park – the river is on your left. Travel south through Kirby Park; the trail crosses an active rail line then PA Route 11 where there is shopping and refreshment. You will see Kirby Park's playing fields, walking paths, exercise stations, duck pond on the river side of the trail, natural areas and riparian forest with walking paths and remnants of a 1930's Olmstead brothers designed park.

4 Forty Fort Reach Levee System:

A 5 mile trail on the west side of the Susquehanna connecting the Anthracite Heritage Trail with the towns of Forty Fort, West Wyoming and beyond. Cross the Market Street Bridge and access the trail in Nesbitt Park heading north; the river is on your right. At the Rutter Avenue and River Street intersection follow the on-street connection signs to the nearby Forty Fort Reach of the levee system. You will see the Luzerne County Courthouse, parks and recreation fields, sweeping river vistas, Forty Fort Meeting House, the historic Swetland Homestead and find shopping and refreshment at the Midway Shopping Center.




About the Greenway
