Transportation Funding Update Bill On The Horizon



Sen. John Rafferty held a news conference or Tuesday, April 16th launching the introduction of Senate Bill 1, his proposed solution to PA's transportation needs. It was a bipartisan gathering in which Rafferty, majority chairman of the Senate Transportation Committee, was joined by his Senate counterpart, John Wozniak, and Dick Hess and Mike McGeehan, House Transportation majority and minority chairs, respectively. The Susquehanna Greenway Partnership (SGP) has been represented on the Keystone

Transportation Funding Coalition by our Board Member Wayne Kober to **voice our support for safer roads, including improved bike and pedestrian trails.** We anticipate the bill will be released soon, and will provide additional information when it is.
