Investing In River Towns Greenway Award for Susquehanna Health



The dream of leaving an older home and finding something "built to suit" in a new development is a thought that often occurs to homeowners looking for more space and less upkeep. The thought also occurred to Susquehanna Health.

Susquehanna Health decided that a multi-million dollar, "green" renovation was the right call for their Williamsport Regional Medical Center. Six years later the work is complete and their commitment to environmental sustainability has resulted in LEED certification at the gold level from the U.S. Green Building Council and in significant reinvestment into this Susquehanna river town.

To honor Susquehanna Health for their efforts to redevelop within the city, incorporate green infrastructure, and focus on walkable/bikeable communities, the Susquehanna Greenway Partnership presented Susquehanna Health with the first Susquehanna Greenway Investing In Healthy River Towns Business Award on July 23, 2013. 
Hunt Joins Chesapeake Bay Office

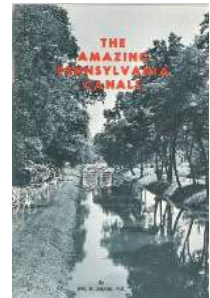
Researchers Along The River: Susquehanna Water Science Forum
