Main St. in Bloomsburg, for the *"Images of the Susquehanna"* photo gallery reception featuring the winning images from last year's photo contest. Enjoy a casual and fun evening featuring stunning photography, light refreshments, entertainment, a photography presentation, and river-themed readings. This event is free and open to the public.

Doug Brubaker, of Looking Back Studio, will present his professional landscape photography and provide simple tips for improving your own outdoor photos. Local authors and poets, Melanie Simms and David Bowman, will share river-related poetry and readings that will inspire budding photographers and river enthusiasts alike. Learn about the Susquehanna Greenway --the largest greenway in PA-- from the Partnership's Board members and staff.

Stay after the reception for the Short Film Festival from the Box of Light Studio. The festival is an opportunity to promote local filmmaking and is open to professionals and amateurs of all ages. "Maybe it's a place to fish, keep cool, or a destination with family and friends. You don't have to be a professional photographer to make it personal, just keep a camera close by so you can share those moments and your stories."

Contest categories include River Towns, Treasured Landscapes, People & the River, and a Youth Category sponsored by Hershey's Track and Field Games for photographers under 18. "We've teamed up with Hershey's to inspire kids to get outside, get active, and explore the Susquehanna region. Kids can show us what they like to do along the river, like hiking with family, splashing with friends, or even a photo of their favorite river town park."
