## **New Chesapeake Bay Agreement Released Call for Public Feedback**

Chesapeake Bay Program partners are seeking public input on a new agreement that will guide the next chapter of restoration across the watershed.

The [draft Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement](#) outlines a new plan for collaboration across the Bay's political boundaries and clarifies the Bay Program's vision and values.

With *more than 17 million people* living in the region, the Bay Program values stakeholder input: individual citizens, private businesses, watershed groups and local governments are key partners in the attainment of restoration goals. A public comment period will run until **March 17, 2014**.

The Center completed new trail grading and other enhancements to protect the trails from erosion and the Wiconisco Creek from sediment pollution. According to Steve Quigley, Executive Director of the Center, the trail improvements have already proven effective. "As soon as the work had completed we experienced two heavy rains. Normally we would see real damage to the trails after one of these storms. The newly improved grading and resurfacing work held up perfectly," says Quigley. The Center plans to extend the same design principles from this project to the rest of the trails throughout the 500 acre property.

## News from the North: Cleaner Water Coming Soon

Every day the Old Forge Borehole releases over 60 million gallons of highly acidic water laden with dissolved metals into the Lackawanna River. This abandoned mine drainage (AMD) enters the Lackawanna River which runs into the North Branch of the Susquehanna River near Duryea. Often labeled the largest, single polluter to the Chesapeake Bay, there is a new effort for water treatment and remediation! ## News from the West: Solution for Trailhead Troubles



The Susquehanna River Walk and Timber Trail is a scenic 4-mile loop trail built on top of the levee system in Williamsport and South Williamsport. It's also something else: Popular. Which makes finding a parking spot sometimes difficult for those who don't live withing walking or biking distance. Recently, SEDA-COG Joint Rail Authority and Lycoming County officials announced a new trailhead with 90 parking spots will be developed this spring in Williamsport at Hepburn Street. ## Lower Susquehanna News:

### Feds Approve Land Transfer

PPL Holtwood's plan to transfer up to 1,260 additional acres of land to the Lancaster County Conservancy for preservation and public use has moved one step closer to reality. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has approved PPL Holtwood's request to transfer ownership of the land. The land is located along the lower Susquehanna River both upstream and downstream of PPL's Holtwood hydroelectric plant. "This decision paves the way for preservation of this beautiful stretch of land for generations to come," said Dennis Murphy, vice president and chief operating officer of PPL Generation's Eastern Fossil and Hydro group. PPL Holtwood previously transferred more than 320 acres to the Lancaster County Conservancy, a move that did not require prior FERC approval. [Read more here.](#)

## New State Funding for Transportation A Win for Greenways!

This past November saw a major win for greenway projects when Governor Tom Corbett signed House Bill 1060-The Comprehensive Transportation Funding Package into law. By the fifth year, the package provides **\$2.3 to \$2.4 billion** in new revenue for roads and bridges, mass transit, and multi-modal transportation (biking, trails, pedestrian facilities). As an active member of the [Keystone Transportation Funding Coalition](#), we advocated for the funding and its greenway-friendly provisions.



Several provisions in the package offer Susquehanna Greenway project partners opportunities to use state funding to help connect people with natural and cultural resources, and promote a sustainable and healthy environment along the Susquehanna! The package sets the stage for working towards an interconnected system of bicycle, pedestrian, and boat access areas and for improved water quality in the river and its tributaries. 
