Creative Path to Cleaner Water for West Branch



Cleaner water will be entering the West Branch of the Susqueh to a new, unique treatment system unveiled near Clearfield Cre County. Just 15 minutes from the river town of Clearfield, the D System treats flows of acidic, metals-laden water or acid mine cemanate from a deep coal mine on the site. It is the first bioreact watershed and uses bacteria to remove metals and reduce acic flows through a mixture of woodchips, mushroom compost, hay settling basins before it continues into Clearfield Creek.
