

# Valley driving tours for 2012 mapped out

LEWISBURG — The Susquehanna Greenway Partnership — an organization dedicated to linking natural, cultural, historic, and recreational resources along the 500-mile corridor of the Susquehanna River — has announced its 2012 Susquehanna Greenway Driving Tour.

The tour stretches for 95 miles along the river, and takes an estimated 2.5 hours of driving time.

Along the way, the route takes tourists through historic river towns, with suggested stops offering extraordinary views of the river valley.

The driving tour begins at the Packwood House in Lewisburg and ends, after 22 suggested stops, in Selinsgrove.

The guided tour takes drivers to Shikellamy State Park

Overlook — and a soaring view from 360 feet above the confluence of the West and North branches of the Susquehanna River — and then the Joseph Priestley House Museum, in Northumberland, the Hunter House Museum and Fort Augusta, in Sunbury, Millersburg Ferry, Duncannon, and Liverpool, before ending in Selinsgrove.

The Susquehanna Greenway Partnership is a leading champion for the Susquehanna River Watershed, advocating for public and private efforts to connect people with the area's natural and cultural resources. The organization also promotes a sustainable and healthy environment.
