HARRISBURG – State Rep. Karen Boback is encouraging local communities situated along the Susquehanna River to apply for mini-grants to <u>fund</u> small projects that would improve the quality of both communities and the river itself.

Boback, R-Harveys Lake, announced today that the Susquehanna Greenway will be implementing the minigrant program.

"As the Commonwealth continues to rebound from the <u>economic</u> recession, these types of grants help our local communities fund projects which include improving trail connections with the river, riverfront parks, river access and <u>infrastructure</u> projects that help protect the water quality of the Susquehanna," Boback said.

The theme for the 2012-13 grant <u>program</u> is "Connecting Susquehanna Greenway River Towns," and funding for the program is provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

A total of \$60,000 in grants will be awarded to the projects that have the greatest benefit and overlap between partner interests. Individual grant awards will be limited to a maximum of \$5,000 for "planning grants" and \$10,000 for "implementation grants."

All municipalities, municipal agencies, and nonprofit agencies that are located within a river community along the Susquehanna in Wyoming, Columbia and Luzerne counties are eligible to apply for this grant.
