### Delaware Township road work

WATSONTOWN — A PennDOT maintenance crew in Northumberland County is scheduled to begin replacing a series of four cross pipes today to improve drainage along Musser Lane in Delaware Township.

The pipes are located between Blue Ball Road and Peach Orchard Road.

The work is expected to continue weekdays until Friday, Sept. 28. As the work takes place, the road will be closed from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily.

A detour will use Main Street in Muncy, Interstate 180 and Route 54.

### Photo reception Saturday
