The Susquehanna Greenway Partnership (SGP) invites photographers to enter digital images in the Third Annual Treasured Towns & Landscapes of the Susquehanna photo contest. Entries will be accepted until February 1, 2013 at

www.susquehannagreenway.org/photo-contest.

Contest categories include Treasured Towns, Treasured Landscapes, People and the River and a Youth Category sponsored by Hershey's <u>Track and Field</u> Games for photographers under 18 years of age.

Cash prizes from \$50 to \$150 will be awarded for first through third-place in each category. Participants are welcome to submit multiple entries.

Photos from the following Susquehanna Greenway counties are eligible: Bradford, Cambria, Centre, Clearfield, Clinton, Columbia, Cumberland, Dauphin, Indiana, Juniata, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Luzerne, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Union, Wyoming and York.

The winning photographs from last year's contest will <u>travel</u> throughout the Susquehanna region and will be exhibited at the Wyoming County Cultural Center at the Dietrich Theatre, 60 E. Tioga <u>St.</u>, Tunkhannock during the month of July.
