



Non-Disaster Mitigation Grants | February 14 Deadline for LOI

The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) has announced two grant opportunities:

- The Building Resilient Infrastructure & Communities (BRIC) aims to support communities as they build capability and capacity. BRIC also encourages and aids innovation. It helps partnerships grow; supports infrastructure projects; and fosters flexibility and consistency. **LEARN MORE**.
- The Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) grant will fund projects that reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage to buildings insured by the National Flood Insurance Program. <u>LEARN MORE</u>.

Community Giving Foundation Grants | February 28 Deadline

Grant rounds include opportunities through Berwick, Bloomsburg, Danville, Selinsgrove, and Sunbury affiliate foundations. To be eligible to receive a grant, an organization must hold a 501(c)(3) nonprofit status or be a governmental organization. **LEARN MORE**.

2025-26 WalkWorks Active Transportation Planning Grant | March 21 Deadline

Walking, biking, using a wheelchair, and accessing public transit are independent, reliable, and resilient transportation modes that are healthy for our bodies, minds, finances, communities, and the environment. The WalkWorks motto is "mobility options for all." The WalkWorks Program looks forward to a time when everyone in Pennsylvania has a full range of transportation options available to them. **LEARN MORE**.

All-Terrain Vehicle & Snowmobile Grant | March 31 Deadline

Administered by DCNR, All-Terrain Vehicle and Snowmobile projects include the planning, acquisition of land, development, rehabilitation, maintenance, purchase of equipment for maintenance and construction, and development of educational programs related to ATV and/or snowmobile trails and facilities. **LEARN MORE**.

Community Conservation Partnership Program | April 2 Deadlines

Administered by DCNR, these grants cover a range of projects dedicated to the Bureau of Recreation and Conservation's mission to build connections between the citizens and the outdoors through recreation enhancement, natural resources conservation, and community revitalization efforts. **LEARN MORE**.

Endless Mountains Heritage Region Partnership Grants | Opens April 2025

The EMHR's Partnership Grants program, also known as mini-grants, provide financial support to heritage partners across the four-county region of Bradford, Sullivan, Susquehanna, & Wyoming. **LEARN MORE**.

Marketing to Attract Tourists Program | Rolling Basis as Available

The Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) announced that applications are being accepted for the Marketing to Attract Tourists Program, which is investing \$6 million to promote overnight tourism stays and attract international, national, and regional visitors to enjoy Pennsylvania's renowned historical sites, main streets and small towns, world-class restaurants and bars, thrilling outdoor recreation, and top tier events and sports. **LEARN MORE**.

Community Heart & Soul Seed Grant Program | Rolling Basis

Administered by The Pennsylvania Humanities Council (PHC) and Community Heart & Soul, this program seeks to help PA small cities, townships, and boroughs to implement the Community Heart & Soul model by providing \$10,000 matching grants to resident-led groups in communities with populations of 2,500 to 30,000. **LEARN MORE**.

Peer & Circuit Rider Grants | Open Year-Round

These DCNR grant programs fund projects that help municipalities, counties, multi-municipal partnerships, and council of governments to increase local capacity for recreation, parks, and conservation. **LEARN MORE**.

RecTAP Grants | Open Year-Round

The Recreation and Parks Technical Assistance Program (RecTAP) is a statewide technical assistance service designed to help organizations receive expert advice on recreation, park, and trail issues. It is funded through DCNR and administered by the Pennsylvania Recreation & Park Society (PRPS). **LEARN MORE**.
