


Length: 7.2 miles (out and back)

Difficulty: Challenging Elevation Gain: 1,525 ft Trail Surface: Natural County: Luzerne


The Tilbury Knob Trail is a 7.2-mile loop in Jackson Township, Luzerne County, PA, rated as challenging. Hikers typically spend 4–5 hours on the trail, which winds through dense, shaded forests and peaceful natural surroundings. Some



sections may be uneven or overgrown due to limited maintenance, but the rugged hike is well worth it for the stunning view at the top! Intrepid adventurers only!





EXPLORE THE MIDDLE SUSQUEHANNA



Length: 7 miles (collectively)
Difficulty: Easy - Moderate
Elevation Gain: 528 ft
Trail Surface: Natural
County: Dauphin

Detweiler Park is the largest of eight public parks owned and managed by the Dauphin County Parks & Recreation Department. This biologically diverse area features a variety of ecosystems, including gardens, open fields, meadows, evergreen plantations,



and mature deciduous forests—all of which can be experienced along the park's five main trails.

Length: 1.9 miles (out and back)

Difficulty: Easy **Elevation Gain:** 19 ft

Trail Surface: Boardwalk, natural

County: Dauphin

The Reservoir Park nature trail in Highspire is a hidden gem tucked within a residential area, featuring a scenic out-and-back route along a central lake. The path is beginner-friendly and fully accessible, with boardwalks that make it wheelchair, stroller, and



kid-friendly. Well-maintained and welcoming, it's a great spot for families and leashed pets alike.
